

Hawaii Search and Rescue Conference (Hawaii SAR CON) COVID-19 Policy

It is expected that when the 2022 Hawaii Search and Rescue Conference (HAWAII SAR CON) occurs on May 20-22, 2022, that the Hawaii State Laws and Kualoa Ranch policies in effect at that time regarding COVID-19 restrictions will allow the full conference agenda with minimal impact to social gathering for class training, field exercises, and related group activities.

Conference sponsors and organizers will enact all appropriate mitigation and safety measures to protect attendees and facility staff at Kualoa Ranch. All attendees will be required to follow published Hawaii State Laws, Hawaii SAR CON policies, and Kualoa Ranch policies that are in effect at the time of the Conference. Failure to do so will result in being removed from the Conference with no refund.

2021 COVID-19 HI SARCON Mitigation Policies and Plans:

- Guests are required to follow State of Hawaii and Kualoa Ranch and Camping policies in effect regarding social distancing, group gatherings, and face masks (gaiters, bandanas, and face shields are not compliant in Hawaii) at all times while anywhere on property.
- Temperatures will be taken at check-in and may be taken at the start of any session or upon entry or re-entry to the facility throughout the conference.
- Anyone feeling sick or unwell should not attend or participate in the conference or related activities.
- Anyone displaying COVID-19 symptoms may be denied entry to the conference.
- It is anticipated that 100% of Hawaii SAR CON and related activities will be conducted outdoors, some under tent cover, including:
 - Group meals
 - Reception
 - Presentations
 - Training exercises
